Criteria for Review of Abstracts By the INS Review Committee:

Quality of the Neuroscience:

- Is the neuroscience presented accurately?
- Are the research methods appropriate for the research question(s)?
- Has the neuroscience contributed to better understanding of the research conducted?

Quality of the Ethics

- Are the ethical issues clearly presented?
- Are they important ethical issues for advancing the field of neuroethics?
- Does the ethical component contribute to empirical and/or conceptual understanding of the issues?

Process for Review by the INS Review Committee:

- Abstracts received by the designated deadline are organized and blinded with each given a number.
- A separate list of authors and affiliations is extracted from the submissions.
- The “author list” is sent to each Reviewer who then advises any Conflict of Interest (COI).
- Once Conflict of Interest is determined, the blinded abstracts are divided among the Reviewers with a deadline date.
