

Registration Stipend Opportunity

The [International Brain Research Organization](#) (IBRO) has generously donated funds for stipends to support the attendance of diverse researchers working in under-resourced countries who want to attend the 2020 INS Annual Meeting, held as a virtual conference on Thursday and Friday, October 22-23 2020.

With IBRO's generous support, the International Neuroethics Society (INS) will be awarding \$5,000 (USD) to individual winners. The value of each stipend is expected to be between \$50 and 200 (USD) to cover the complete cost of registration. Stipends may only be used to cover registration fees for the [2020 INS Annual Meeting](#).

To be considered for this stipend, individual researchers must submit an abstract for presentation at the INS annual meeting. Submitted abstracts must meet all requirements and be accepted by the INS Program Committee. Please review the [abstract call](#) for submission requirements, deadlines and details.

All researchers who submit an abstract and who work in under-resourced countries ([defined by the World Bank](#) as an 'upper-middle', 'lower-middle' and 'low' income economy) are eligible for this travel grant. Preference in selection will be given to women and to diverse individuals (e.g. minority groups and persons with disabilities).

Letters of acceptance will be distributed to all abstract authors no later than August 30. To stipend recipients, the INS can provide a letters confirming that the author's abstract has been accepted, that the author is expected to give a presentation at the meeting, and the author is has been selected to receive funds to defray the cost of attending.

Applicants should be aware that the virtual meeting will require a reliable internet connect that can stream video presentations.

IBRO also requires that all stipend recipients complete the online [IBRO Grant Report Form](#) after attending the meeting.
